

WHAT IS TITLE I ?

Title I began in 1965 (ESEA) as a federal program to ensure equal opportunities for low- income school districts.

Through Title I , the federal government disburses money to school districts based on the number of low-income families in each district as determined by census data.

The school uses its Title I money to supplement and improve educational programs offered to help ALL students meet state standards.



The Purpose of Title I



... is to ensure that **ALL** students have a **fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education** and **reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging State academic achievement standards and State academic assessments.**

All Meriwether County Schools are Title I Schools!

All Title I Schools shall: Develop a School-Wide Plan



- Conduct a **needs assessment/parent survey** on the types of programs we offer and use parent input to guide our decision making on ways to help students
- We hold **Parent workshops / presentations** to train and inform parents about standards, assessments, etc...
- **Use Title I Money to provide ALL students with services** to help them achieve academic success
- We **establish goals** based on multiple pieces of data and determine how we are going to meet our goals through programs & interventions

UES Goals for FY25-26

Goal Area 1: Increase Student Achievement in Reading

- 1) On the Spring 2026 ELA EOG assessment, UES will increase the percentage of students scoring proficient and above by 5 percentile points AND decrease the percentage scoring beginning level by 5 percentile points.

Goal Area 2: Increase Student Achievement in Math

- 2) On the Spring 2026 Math EOG assessment, UES will increase the percentage of students scoring proficient and above by 5 percentile points AND decrease the percentage scoring beginning level by 5 percentile points.

Goal Area 3: Increase Student Achievement in Science

- 3) On the Spring 2026 Science EOG assessment, UES will increase the percentage of students scoring proficient and above by 5 percentile points AND decrease the percentage scoring beginning level by 5 percentile points.

Goal Area 4: Improve Student Discipline

- 4) During the 2025-2026 school year, UES will decrease the percentage of students receiving ISS by 10 percent.

GMS Goals for FY25-26

Goal Area 1: Increase Student Achievement in Reading

1. By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, Greenville Middle School will have an increase of at least 5% of students scoring “Developing or higher” in ELA on the Georgia Milestone Assessment

Goal Area 2: Increase Student Achievement in Math

2. By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, Greenville Middle School will have an increase of at least 10% of students scoring “Developing or higher” in Math on the Georgia Milestone Assessment.

Goal Area 3: Increase Student Achievement in Social Studies & Science

3. By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, Greenville Middle School will have an increase of at least 10% of students scoring “Developing or higher” in Science and Social Studies on the Georgia Milestone Assessment.

GHS Goals for FY25-26

Goal Area 1:

1. Greenville High School will obtain a 5% increase in the percentage of students scoring developing or higher on the 2025-2026 Georgia Milestones through engaging, data-driven, rigorous, evidence-based instruction.


Goal Area 2:

By establishing a strong communication process and partnership plan, Greenville High School will increase the involvement of parents, families, and the community in the support, engagement, activities, and improvement of education for the students at Greenville High by 10% for the 2025-2026 school year.

College and Career Ready Performance Index ~ CCRPI

- Georgia uses the **College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI)** for state accountability purposes.
- The CCRPI is like a **REPORT CARD** for schools.
- CCRPI has multiple indicators to determine a school's performance, rather than using a single test score given at one point in time.
